and accurate as of the certified date. The Approval of Engineering Amendment and the associated fees should not be interpreted as approval for additional grants funds. This approval will verify that any effort expended by your consultant for the approved services on or after the date of this letter will be considered as eligible for reimbursement under the terms and conditions of the Clean Water Fund once your funding application has been approved.

You are reminded that the Clean Water Fund MBE/WBE requirements are applicable to this approval. The goal for participation by subconsultants is 3.0% of the total approved contract amount for Minority Owned Business Enterprises (MBEs), and 5.0% of the total approved contract amount for Women Owned Business Enterprises (WBEs). The engineer is required to submit executed subagreements meeting or exceeding this goal within fifteen (15) days of executing the engineering contract or the date of this approval, whichever is later. No payments will be processed by DEP for engineering services until these goals have been met and the appropriate executed subagreements have been submitted.
